

## Shopping at New Zealand International Airports



Ask your airport retailer about what you can take in your carry-on luggage

**FLY SMART**  
PACK SMART /// TRAVEL SAFE

Before you leave home, work out what liquids, aerosols and gels you will need for your flight. Ensure that these are in containers of 100ml or less. Pack these in a one litre resealable plastic bag (20cm X 20cm) in your carry on baggage. Put anything not needed for the flight in your checked-in baggage.

**New security rules for liquids, gels and aerosols (LAGs) in your carry-on luggage now apply when you fly out of New Zealand.**

**LAGs are anything that you can pour, smear or spray.**

## Buying Tips



Buying and travelling with your duty free and other retail purchases won't change for most passengers.



Travellers flying direct to their final destination from a New Zealand airport can purchase duty free and other retail products as usual once past security screening.



Travellers stopping over or transiting through another airport on route to their final destination might be affected.



*Buy before you fly* - You can pre-purchase duty free and pick it up on your return to New Zealand.



You can still buy or collect duty free goods on arrival in New Zealand.

- ✓ You are travelling direct to your final destination
- ✓ You can purchase any items as usual after security

## Direct Flight

Mr D is travelling on a non stop flight to Brisbane. After clearing security screening he can purchase duty free and other retail products and carry these onto the aircraft.

- ✓ You have access to your checked-in luggage at your next destination
- ✓ At your next destination you must pack your purchases into your checked in luggage before continuing your journey

## Stopover Flight

Mrs S is travelling to Europe via Australia and is breaking her journey in Sydney for a day. After clearing security screening she is able to purchase duty free and other retail products and carry these onto the aircraft. In Sydney she must pack these items into her luggage to be checked in for the next leg of her journey.

**CHECK WITH YOUR DUTY FREE RETAILER BEFORE BUYING 'LIQUID' PRODUCTS AT NZ AIRPORTS TO TAKE WITH YOU**

- ✓ You do not have access to your checked-in luggage at your next destination because it is checked-in to your final destination

## Transfer or Transit Flights

Mr T is travelling to London via Sydney. He is changing international airlines at Sydney airport and as he passes through the transit screening point at Sydney he will be asked to surrender any items that do not meet the new security rules. To avoid this happening Mr T could pre-purchase his duty free products prior to his departure and collect these on his return to New Zealand.
